DAILY ITINERARY



Day 1, Wednesday 5th June UK/ Warsaw

Fly from London Gatwick direct to Warsaw. Upon arrival transfer to our hotel by coach, check-in to our hotel for one night. Free time before evening dinner.

Day 2, Thursday 6th June Warsaw/Lewiczyn/Czestochowa:

After breakfast, we leave Warsaw. We travel to Czestochowa, making a short stop via Grójec and Lewiczyn, where Fr Stan conducted his first Mass. Continue on to Czestochowa – Home of Miraculous Icon of Our Lady, known as the Black Madonna, the Queen of Poland. This is considered the holiest place in Poland and is the third largest Catholic pilgrimage site in the world. The sanctuary is in the Pauline Monastery in Jasna Góra, which has been a major destination of pilgrimages for centuries. We will celebrate Mass here. Travel to Krakow, check-in to the hotel for 5 nights. Dinner here.

Day 3, Friday 7th June Wawel Cathedral/St Mary's Basilica

After breakfast, coach transfer to Wawel Cathedral. Sightseeing tour of this magnificent cathedral including the chapel where St John Paul II celebrated his first Mass. We also visit Sigismund Chapel, a masterpiece of Renaissance art and architecture. The tombs of many of Poland's kings and queens and their greatest national heroes are located here. Afterwards walk to St Mary's Square (Market Square) one of the largest and oldest squares in Europe where we will have a guided tour of St Mary's Basilica - one of the finest Gothic structures in the country. Note: if you wish to take pictures inside the basilica there is a charge of 5 euros. We will have lunch in the square; there are many cafés and restaurants to choose from. If time permits we can have a look at the covered market where you may purchase local produce such as jewelry, bags and hand painted ornaments. Return to the hotel for dinner.

Day 4, Saturday 8th June Wadowice/Kalwaria

After breakfast we drive to Wadowice, the home town of St John Paul II. We visit the Holy Father's House, now a museum, and the parish church where he was baptised. It is considered one of the most beautiful churches in Poland. We will celebrate Mass here followed by a guided tour

of this historic site. We stop at Kalwaria Zebrzydowska - Poland's first Calvary sanctuary, established in 1600. St John Paul II visited here with his father as a boy and often during his priestly life. On his first pilgrimage to Poland in 1979, he said, "I would like you to pray for me here, both during my life and after it." We return to our hotel for dinner.

Day 5, Sunday 9th June Auschwitz

Today we visit Auschwitz Birkenau visiting the former concentration camp which was the scene of terrible human suffering during the Second World War. We see the cell of St Maximilian Kolbe where he died giving up his life to save another. (Auschwitz is not suitable for visitors under 15 years of age). Return to the hotel for dinner.



Day 6, Monday 10th June Krakow/Wieliczka Salt Mine

Breakfast at the hotel followed by Mass at the Sanctuary and afterwards we journey by coach to visit the Wieliczka Salt Mine (a UNESCO world



heritage site). There we will travel underground for approximately 2km to the oldest part of the mine and visit its subterranean museum. This mine has been worked for 700 years until the present day. We return to the Sanctuary and join the nuns at 3pm to say the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, after which we will participate in the Mass for the pilgrims at the Basilica. After Mass we will meet with the nuns who will give a talk to the group about the life of St Faustina. Dinner at the hotel.

Day 7, Tuesday 11th June Krakow/UK

Depending on the time of our flight departure, we may celebrate Mass in one of the Chapels in St Faustina's Shrine. Proceed to the airport for our flight back to London.
